Rewards

You MUST begin by reading books from the above list until you get to 10!

3 Books from the list—Reward choice—rubber duck, bookmark, pen, etc.
6 Books from the list—Reward choice—rubber duck, bookmark, pen, etc.
10 books from the list--\$10 gift card—iTunes or Amazon (certificate at awards assembly)

After reading at least 10 books from the list:

Read an additional 10 free choice books—\$10 gift card (in addition to \$10 you received at 10 books)

Finish reading all 20 books on the list (no free choice books)—\$20 gift card (in addition to \$10 you received at 10 books)

Read all 20 books on the list plus 10 free choice—\$10 gift card (in addition to \$10 and \$20 you received at 10 and 20 books from the list.)

The FINE PRINT

- If you have read a book *from the list* during the summer before the current school year, you may count it. Otherwise you need to read it again.
- Free choice books should come from our YA or YA78 section.
- Free choice books should be something you have *never read before* and must be read *during the current school year*. Nothing from the summer will count.
- Any books you would like to read from our Fiction, Nonfiction, or Biography sections must be **pre-approved** (ask permission first!) by Mrs. Brown or Mrs. Pierson.
- Free choice books that are not from our library must be an appropriate interest level and require a different form to be filled out to receive credit.

Deadlines:

Tuesday, February, 20, 2018—

- You must have completed your 10 books *from the list* by this date in order to continue on to higher levels of rewards.
- All students who have read at least 3 books from the Caudill list by this date will be able to vote for their favorite book by the voting deadline of February 28, 2018 (even if you didn't make it to 10). Mrs. Brown will contact you to vote.
- Students who have read 10 books will receive a certificate at the awards assembly in May and an invitation to the open house on May 2.

Monday, April 16, 2018—Final deadline for students to turn in book forms and receive rewards.

For parents of 6th graders: Five of these titles are shelved in our YA78 section, which is normally checked out only to 7th and 8th graders at our school. Please initial here if you give your child permission to read these five books for the program. According to the official Caudill program, these titles are generally offered to students in 6th-8th grades and even down to 4th grade at some schools. However, if you would prefer that your child not read them, they can still participate in the program since they are only required to read 10 books from the list and they also have the option of reading free choice books after that.

For ALL Parents:

*A note about the book *I Will Always Write Back*: This is a phenomenal true story about a 7th grade girl named Caitlin who becomes pen pals with a boy from Zimbabwe and gains a totally different perspective on her own life and the lives of people in 3rd world countries. Even as an adult reader, I found this book to be eye-opening about the luxury we experience daily compared to so many people around the world. It is an inspiring story of how several people's lives were changed because of one letter that started it all. However, there are a few mentions of instances in which Caitlin makes some poor choices during high school regarding alcohol and drug use. In both cases, the influencing friends are not cast in a positive light, and I felt the value of the book outweighed these brief situations and that our students could handle this content without being influenced by it.

A label inside the book reads:

"WCGS does not support substance abuse or under-age drinking mentioned briefly in this book. We recognize that secular culture may have different standards regarding these topics, and we are confident that WCGS students understand the importance of obeying the law, being good stewards of their bodies, and making wise choices about those with whom they spend their time."

I wanted to make you aware of this content so that you could decide whether you want your child to read this book or not and discuss it with them if they do.
