## 2019 WCGS Summer Reading Challenge Rising 7th and 8th Graders

It is our hope that one of the highlights of each summer is the opportunity for leisure reading. **Therefore**, we feel that an appropriate challenge/goal for our junior high students is to read a total of 600-800 pages over the summer break. Students will meet this goal in the following ways:



- 1. Students will be required to choose **at least one book from the**<u>attached</u> list which can also be found on our school website under the summer reading link on the home page.
- 2. Students can use **books of their choice** to meet the rest of the page requirement. For example:

Book from list—245 pages Free choice book(s)—429 pages

Total: 674 pages

All books students record on the attached log should be books they have not read before. Students should choose one of their summer titles to complete a book review assignment when they return to school in August. Examples of such assignments could include: Fish Bowl, creative presentation, written book review. They will receive the specifics of the assignment during the first week of school. We strongly recommend that students take notes on the literary elements (i.e., character traits, setting, plot, themes, message, and biblical worldview) on the book they will want to use for the first assignment. Students should also have a copy of the selected book available during the first week of school. The following reading log will also be collected the first week of school.
